Mallory Jansen is an Australian-British actress, born and raised in Melbourne. She recently starred in FOX's ballet themed dramedy series "The Big Leap" from 20th Television Studio and producers Liz Heldens (Friday Night Lights), Sue Nagle (Pam & Tommy), and Jason Winer (Modern Family).

Mallory studied drama in New York at Stella Adler and T. Schreiber Studios, being coached by some of the world's best acting, accent, analysis, method and film teachers.

After completing her studies, Mallory returned to Australia where she quickly scored roles on a string of mini-series hits. However, it was her role playing supermodel Helena Christensen on "Never Tear Us Apart: The Untold Story of INXS" that made a name for her in Australian TV.

Upon moving to Los Angeles she immediately landed a recurring role in Freeform's "Young & Hungry", shortly followed by another recurring role on ABC Family's hit show "Baby Daddy".

Mallory then went on to play the starring role of Madalena in ABC's medieval musical comedy series "Galavant", written and created by Dan Fogelman (This Is Us). The series featured live musical performances by Mallory from award-winning composer and Broadway legend, Alan Menken (The Little Mermaid, Beauty and the Beast). Jansen garnered critical acclaim for her portrayal of the sharp-tongued and hilariously evil Queen.

After wrapping the second season of "Galavant", Mallory landed a lead role in ABC's large scale drama "Triangle", as well as the fourth season of ABC's hit series "Marvel's Agents of S.H.I.E.L.D." Over the course of the season, she portrayed three different roles, including the iconic Marvel comic book character, Madame Hydra.

Other TV appearances include "This Is Us", "American Housewife", and the recurring role of Special Agent Margo James in Mark Wahlberg's action-packed drama "Shooter" on USA Network.

All Hail the Queen



MALLORY JANSEN STEALS THE SPOTLIGHT AND COMMANDS ATTENTION ON ABC'S 'GALAVANT'

ot all darmeels in distress want to be rescued—and Modalena on ABC's new medieval musical corredy, "Galavant," definitely doesn't need a kinght in shining armor. Even after she's kidnapped by an avil king and her former lever Galavant sets out on a queet to rescue her, she knows where her priorities lie. "We were going to live in a cottage by the sea," he tails her. "We were going to make love, plant a garden, have children. I was going to sing songs of your beauty."

"Ch, Gal." Madalena says. "That sounds awfull Look around. Hive in a castlef. And you know what I've learned about movelf? I really like sruff. I mean, why would I give all this up to get fat and pregnant and grow my own food?"

This is the appeal of "Calavant," created by writer-essective produce: Dan Fugeiman ("Cazay, Stupid, Love," "Tangled"), legendary composer Alan Menises ("The Little Mermaid," "Aladdis"), and Glenn Slater, and starring Joshua Sasse as the titular knight and Mallory Jansen as his nearmatic.

"I tend in look at the show as a demerted version of a fairy tale," says Jansen, laughing, "It's not your typical fairy tale; it's not what it looks like. It's very funny, very tongue-in-cheek, quite risqué."

And much like the show itself, which promisered Jan. 4, Madalena isn't your typical queen. "I just kind of see her as a modern woman in medieval times," the Australian-born actor explains. "She knows exactly what she wants. She's power-hungry, she's man-hungry, she's money-hungry, and nothing is ever good enough for her."

To capture this powerful woman in her audition, Jansen sang "Gimme Gimms" from "Thoroughly Modern Millie," "I was thinking of going with one of Alan Menken's sengs, but I thought, If Alan Menken is gonna be in the room I think! will actually flip out," she says, "I Gimmo Gimmo"] waited my character so much; she's a strong character—very hallsy, very



womanly-and I just thought it was kind of dark as well,"

Jansen's approach to acting reflects that same strong independence and drive. "I woke up one morning and said, "I've got to do this," and saved up all my money and just flew over and hoped it would all work

out," she says of her decision to move to New York City in 2011. Studying at the Stella Adler Studio of Acting and the T. Schreiber Studio. & Theutre, Lansen says she took things from every teacher to develop her own singular approach.

In addition, she says her recurring roles on ABC Family's "Young and 'Hungry" and "Baby Duddy" provided the comedic training that helped her land "Galayant."

"Doing comedy is one of the best gifts in life," the actor says. "Two never leaghed so hard; to me it's just such a privilege to be on set every day, trause it doesn't feel like work at all."

To her fellow actors, Jansen says, "Don't be scared of not getting a job" when yeu're up for a part. While the audition for "Calavant" called for a "Broadway-caliber voice" and she had never sang professionally before, she channeled Madalena's fervor, went for a ... and lived happily ever after.

MODELING VS. ACTING: Definitely acting! Other than the traveling, I never loved modeling. I don't think I was ever the greatest model anyway. I can't walk in heels to save myself!

FROM AUSTRALIA TO THE STATES: First, I had to learn how to drive on the other side of the road. Then, once I had that mastered, I thought I'd do as the LA locals do and order juices using positive affirmations such as "I am succulent" and "I am strong." I've also started hiking, which turns out to be just like walking. It didn't take me long to adapt, I love it here.

MUSICAL COMEDY BASED IN MEDIEVAL TIMES: When I try to explain the concept of Galavant to anyone I am always confronted with perplexed looks. The words 'medieval,' 'musical,' and 'comedy' are not typically used in the same sentence, but somehow the show just works. It's as if The Princess Bride and Monty Python had a baby, and that baby turned out to be an epic demented fairy tale called Galavant. I remember the very first time I read the script before the audition and I was actually laughing hysterically aloud. That's how I knew this show was a winner from the beginning.

SINGING IN THE AUDITIONS: I've always liked to sing, but had never done so professionally. The audition notes stipulated (in caps and bold) that "ALL ROLES MUST SING AT A BROADWAY CALIBER LEVEL." Whilst this was a little daunting to say the least, I immediately enrolled in singing lessons and practiced for hours every single day. I knew I was getting somewhere when my neighbors started compliment-


ing me on my voice. At the final network test, I sang "Gimme Gimme" from *Thoroughly Modern Millie*, and in the spirit of comedy I incorporated some slightly awkward yet dazzling moves into the routine. I'm just glad Alan Menken wasn't sitting in on that one or I would have flipped out!

AUSTRALIAN STARS: I am actually obsessed with Cate Blanchett, to the point where I think I would make a complete fool of myself if I ever met her. I have so much respect for her as an actor. She's also never forgotten her Australian roots, which is evident with her continuous work at the Sydney Theatre Company.

ROOTS: I come from a small family and grew up in the outer suburbs of Melbourne. I was into ballet growing up. I also loved the arts and spent most of my lunch times in high school either painting or in the photography dark room. I never enjoyed school; I was always hanging onto the day that I graduated, so I could travel and see the world. Modeling allowed me to live in cities like New York, London, Paris, Milan, Hong Kong, and Singapore. In 2011, while living in New York, I quit modeling allogether to study drama, and my love for acting has grown ever since then.

DOWNIIME: I love going to the movies by myself in the middle of the day; I'm often the only one in the cinema and it's like my own private viewing. I'm also a massive foodie, I don't like to cook it, just eat it. I keep a list of places in each city that I want to try.

Galavant premiered over the halicay sesson to positive reviews, and more importantly, good ratings, filling in the coveted slot of the popular show, Onco Upon A Time. Organol by Can Fogolman (the writer behing Crazy, Stupid, Love and longles), and with music by Alan Mencen (Disney's Beauty And The Reest, Aladdin, etc. etc), an initial eight half-nour episodes of Galavant were completed and screened in the US to positive bury.

"It has elements of Monty Python and The Princess Brids and Robin Hood, and it's very tengue-in-check," continues Jansen when we catch her via Skype from Los Angeles, "Galavont 'Joshua Sasse] and I start off madly in love, and then the evil King Highard [Timothy Umunson] decides that I'm the one that he wares to kidnop and marry, so he takes me to his kingdom, and the whole story is about Galavant's quest to save me. But unfortunately. my character has got a taste of the good file with the king. ... to drama school." Instead of studying at home, Jansen

She loves the fame and the fortune, and she's discovering herselfies a woman. She's an interesting character to play: she's a psychoceth, cymphomaniac, egomeniac...she's a true villair, but loveable, in a way. It's a great concept. We make fun of ourselves, and we break the fourth wall. Sometimes when people break into song, we roll our eyes, file, 'Oh, this again!' And we have so many great gues. stars fike John Stamps, Tugh Bonneville, Ricky Gervais, Butger Hauer, and Weird Al Yankovic. Everyone was soexcited to do something so different."

Prior to landing the singing-came ng-hamming-it-up plum role in Galavant, Mailory Jonsen was best chown to Australian aucionees at loast - for playing the small part. of Helena Christensen in the INXS telemovie, Never lear Us Apart. So how old this ex-model take such a giant leap? "My neart was never in modelling," conlesses Jansen, who started at fifteer. "I felt unfulfilled, and I always crewthat there was something also but there for me. When I was about nineteen, worke up and said, Treed to go

moved to New York, "Lalways had this dream of fiving there, and I just thought, 'This is the place to be because T's where theatre is. Seemingly a world away, when we catch Jansen, she is smack larg in the micalle of the promotional trail for Galayant, "It's been so much fun," she amiles. "I went to the BAFIAs and The Golden Globes! I never thought that "dibe in a room with John Legend here, Patricia Arquette in the corner, and Taylor Swift over there. It is so surreal and so cool. At the end of the day, we're all just humans, and we're all the same. I saw 'Never Tear Us Apert star] Luke Arnolo the other night at a party, which is so random. He was there for Black Sails. It brought us back to our


